Why author identifiers, why ORCID?

- It can be difficult to link publications to a researcher
 - Namesakes
 - Multiple names
 - Mistakes in the publication process
 - Matching algorithm of databases need help


ORCID

- ORCID iD 16-digit persistent researcher identifier
- ORCID record connect your ID to your affiliations, grants, publications, peer reviews etc.
- ORCID registry 'database' of the ORCID records
- Wizards, Integrations and APIs to enable interoperability between an ORCID record and systems of member organizations



Why use ORCID when submitting a publication?





ORCID iDs in Web of Science: Public API

 The ORCID iDs are shown when the article is visible to 'everyone' in the ORCID record





Adding publications to your ORCID record




Publications (Works in ORCID)

- Published with your ORCID iD
 - Added to your ORCID record via the auto-update workflow from Crossref
 - You have to give Crossref permission to do this


- Published without your ORCID iD
 - Add via 'Search & Link Wizard'
 - Scopus
 - Europe PubMed Central
 - Crossref Metadata Search (one by one, search by DOI)
 - Add manually
 - In the future: allow Pure to auto-update your ORCID record





First step


- Connect your ORCID iD to your EDR account
 - Authorize access for figshare
- Check the ORCID settings in your EDR account
 - Mark Push data to my ORCID

New Datasets

- When added to the EDR your ORCID iD is added to the metadata of the dataset
- Datasets will be added to your ORCID record by figshare

- Make sure your ORCID iD is connected to your EDR account
 - Authorize access for figshare
- Check the ORCID settings in your EDR account
 - Mark Push data to my ORCID

New Datasets

- When added to the EDR your ORCID iD is added to the metadata of the dataset
- Datasets will be added to your ORCID record by figshare


Datasets already in the EDR

- Use the Search & Link Wizard from DataCite
- Authorize access for DataCite
- Find your datasets in DataCite Search https://search.datacite.org
- Click Add to ORCID record under the dataset



DataCite

Enable the DataCite Search & Link and Auto-Update services. Search the DataCite Metadata Store to find your research datasets, images and other works, and link them to your ORCID record. Give DataCite permission to automatically add newly published works with a DataCite DOI that contain your ORCID identifier to your ORCID record. >



Peer Review

- Are added by 'trusted organizations' with your explicit permission
 - Organizer of the peer review OR
 - Third party review recognition service: Publons
- Publons https://publons.com
 - Publons = Author profile from Clarivate (Web of Science)
 - Some publishers are Publons partners reviews are added automatically to Publons
 - Previous peer reviews can be added
 - Grant Publons permission to update your ORCID works



Recommended next steps

- Check your ORCID record
 - Add 'Erasmus University Rotterdam' under Employment
 - Add Name variants under 'Also known as'
 - Under Account settings, check the visibility preferences
 - Use Everyone as the default
 - Except for your e-mailaddress: Trusted parties
 - Under Account settings, check the notification preferences
- When asked, authorize Crossref to auto-update your record
- Provide your ORCID iD when submitting new articles, datasets, peer reviews etc.
- When you have time: update the Works section add publications via Scopus, Europe PubMed Central and/or Crossref Metadata Search or manually
